Community Update by George Crum Police Chief

As I complete my second year as your Police Chief in Cathedral City I want to take this opportunity to tell you about three employees who were recently recognized for their excellent work ethic and contributions to Cathedral City in 2016. Officer Dwayne Hodge, Dispatcher Jennifer Nellis and Volunteer David Bryan were recognized last month at the 20th Annual Peace Officer and Public Safety Luncheon in Rancho Mirage for their dedication and hard work in their respective fields.



Officer **Dwayne Hodge** was named Officer of the Year for his work as the Department's Homeless Liaison Officer. The Cathedral City Police Department implemented a Homeless Liaison Officer Program in November 2015 which was designed to compassionately handle issues and problems related to homelessness and develop solutions to the complicated and intertwined problems of mental health as well as chemical and alcohol dependency. The program provides the homeless and Cathedral City residents and business owners with an officer as a point-of-contact for enforcement of municipal codes, criminal codes and problem solving with the goal of improving quality of life.

During the year, Officer Hodge responded to 372 homeless related calls for service. In comparison, the rest of the department responded to 465 homeless related calls for service. Officer Hodge has made 55 homeless related arrests and written numerous citations related to criminal and municipal code violations. However, the department is most proud of his efforts to reunite people with their families in their respective hometowns. Reuniting a family member is not as simple as buying them a bus ticket home. Officer Hodge contacts family members and verifies they will be met with a safe return home to their family and community. He has reunited over 12 people with family members since the inception of this program. In addition, he has successfully placed over 18 people into various programs at CVRM and works daily – not to move our less fortunate transient residents into another town – but to help them to "get off of the street."

Officer Hodge does not have an assignment that is glamourous; at times it is more dangerous to his health than the job of a gang officer or SWAT officer, yet he has accepted the added hazards and perils. He knows that his down-to-earth approachability and his no-nonsense mannerisms help business owners and the less fortunate find solutions to their issues while improving the quality of life for the residents of Cathedral City.

Dispatcher **Jennifer Nellis** was recognized as the Dispatcher of the Year for her handling of a sexual assault call on Sunday September 28, 2016 at approximately 0138 hours. Nightshift Officers were dispatched to a residence regarding an armed sexual predator. The suspect had fled the scene and Officers worked throughout the night in an effort to identify and locate the suspect.

When Dayshift came on duty, both Dispatch and Patrol dayshift employees were briefed with pertinent details regarding the suspect, vehicle and evidence. In part the information provided during briefing included possible suspect items left at the scene as a result of the suspect being interrupted. There had also been a suspicious occupied vehicle check that came in from the area of the residence. Officers were dispatched to the location of the suspicious occupied vehicle but the vehicle was gone from the scene by the time officers arrived.

At approximately 0933 officers were dispatched to the Rite Aid on Ramon Rd at Date Palm due to a suspicious male subject who had been in the bathroom for an extended length of time. Officers conducted a brief investigation but there appeared to be no crime. However, further diligence on the part of Dispatcher Nellis prompted her to contact Officer(s) at the scene alerting them to the suspicious vehicle seen near the victim's residence earlier in the morning. Dispatcher Nellis provided Officers with additional details regarding the connection to the sexual assault enabling Officers to identify and arrest the suspect for numerous felonies; with additional enhancements and his bail was set at 1.1 million dollars.

Dispatcher Nellis' perceptive analysis of details associated with a sexual assault was communicated to Officers in the field and provided a link between property left at the crime scene and the subject now stopped at Rite Aid. Dispatcher Nellis' actions resulted in the apprehension of this sexual predator before he could strike again.

Volunteer **David Bryan** was named Volunteer of the Year for his outstanding contribution to community service, dedication to our agency and unmatched work ethic. In May of this year, David was approached with the idea of applying his experience and expertise in the testing and evaluation of body worn cameras for patrol officers in the field. It wasn't but a week later, David took full responsibility of the project and spearheaded the most comprehensive product evaluation the Body Worn Camera industry has seen to date. David accepted an unbelievable amount of responsibility when he agreed to this product evaluation which was no easy task. David logged hundreds of hours in this endeavor at both the Cathedral City Police Department and at home. Every vendor whose product was subjected to David's intense scrutiny unanimously agreed their product and company has never been evaluated to the extent David Bryan's research imposed. At the conclusion of his research, he presented an expert recommendation through a Power point presentation and a 127 page product review comparison, which spanned 3 months of grueling research.




