### Cathedral City Begins the Process for Creating Council Districts

For some time now the City Council has been considering when, and under what circumstances, Cathedral City should make the switch from electing Councilmembers atlarge to electing them from districts. Briefly, the "at-large" Council election method, the system Cathedral City has used up to this point, provides that Councilmembers can live anywhere in the City and all five Councilmembers are elected by all the voters in the City. The "by-district"



Council election method, the system to which Cathedral City will be transitioning, provides that the City is divided into five Council districts with each district electing one Councilmember.

Candidates for a district seat must live in that district and only voters who live in the district may participate in the district Council election.

The City Council has opted to follow a detailed process to develop and adopt Council district maps as the City converts from "at-large" to "by-district" elections. The process is designed to provide ample opportunity for the public to participate in the process. The schedule adopted by Council resolution requires that two public hearings are held before work begins on drawing the district maps. The first of those public hearings was held this week during the Council meeting on April 12 and the second will be held during the Council meeting on April 26.

The Council awarded a contract back in January to National Demographics Corporation (NDC), a firm that has the specific expertise necessary to guide the City through the map drawing process and to make sure the districts ultimately considered comply with the federal and state Voting Rights laws. Further, Council took the additional step of providing an on-line map drawing tool, available through NDC that will allow any interested person to prepare their own draft maps for consideration. http://lexington.caliper.com/CathedralCity/ The deadline for community members to submit their draft maps is May 15 and NDC will post their draft maps, along with any prepared by the public, to the City website by May 18.

Another public hearing will be held during the Council meeting on June 14 to allow the public to comment on any of the draft maps provided. A second public hearing for the same purpose will then be held on July 12. Adoption of the final district maps, after all input from the Community, will occur at the two regular Council meetings in August, with first reading scheduled for August 9 and second reading on August 23. The first "by-district" Council election would then occur for three

Council seats during the November 2018 general election. The other two seats will be elected "by-district" during the November 2020 general election.

I have worked in cities that elected their Councils through both "at-large" and "by-district" systems. Either system can work just fine if the community is active and engaged in their local government, and many in Cathedral City are involved. So take this opportunity to draw your preferred district map, if you are so inclined. Who knows, you may design the map that is ultimately adopted.




