Cathedral City leads the way in providing outdoor facilities that encourage active forms of mobility in the Coachella Valley. Our constituents are literally on the move and continue to request more walking and bicycling modes. The City Council and staff are committed to providing more facilities as the funding becomes available. The City's Engineering Department has been focusing on both stand-alone active transportation projects via grants as well as incorporating new and/or upgraded active transportation facilities within the current and planned roadway rehabilitations and expansions.

One of the stand-alone Active Transportation Projects currently underway is **The Cathedral City Whitewater Bike Path Project**. This \$3.5 million project consists of an 8-inch concrete path along approximately 2.2 miles of the west bank of the Whitewater River between Vista Chino and Ramon Road in both the cities of Cathedral City and Palm Springs. The pedestrian, bicycle and neighborhood electric vehicle (NEV) friendly path will be of varying widths up to 14 feet. The Project includes concrete retaining walls, decomposed granite landscape improvements, water fountains, solar pathway lights and shaded benches at each end of the path. When completed the Project will feature an impressive seeded glass concrete design, themed directional signage and with architecturally designed shade structures. All these features and amenities will provide the user with an aesthetically pleasing experience as the Project was designed to seamlessly incorporate into the upcoming valley-wide CV Link Project.

Funding for this \$3.5 million Bike Path is being provided by two State Bicycle Transportation Grants awarded to the City in 2008 and 2009 and Air Quality Mitigation Grants provided through he Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG). The City worked with several agencies

and private parties to make this Project happen including: Riverside County Flood Control District, the Coachella Valley Water District, Desert Water Agency, the City of Palm Springs, Escena Homeowners Association and Warrior Golf Equities. This Project is scheduled to be completed this fall and will be the first of its kind to incorporate pedestrians, bicyclists, and low speed-electric vehicles in one Project.

In the continuing effort to enhance active transportation opportunities within the City, the \$3.5 million **Vista Chino Street Improvement Project** has been completed and is now open to all vehicular traffic, pedestrian and bicycling traffic. The entire two-mile stretch of Vista Chino between Date Palm Drive to the end of the City limits at the east bank of the Whitewater River Channel was reconstructed to include a new road with a rubber cap, sidewalks where needed, replacement of curb and gutter at various locations to improve drainage, new signage and updated ADA curb ramps. One of the final steps in the Project was to apply new striping along the length of the roadway, which included widened bicycle lanes in each direction that will conveniently link to the new Cathedral City Whitewater Bike Path above.

Funding from the Vista Chino Project was secured from Gas Tax Funds, adjacent Assessment District funds and a \$1.0 million contribution from the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians.

On the other end of the City at the Date Palm Drive Bridge and over the Whitewater Channel, you will notice construction activity starting to progress. The City has contracted with Riverside Construction Co., Inc. to complete the **Date Palm Bridge Over Whitewater River Project**. This approximately \$19 million construction project will widen and improve the existing bridge and roadway to three lanes in each direction on Date Palm Drive between Gerald Ford Drive and Perez Road. This Project will feature expanding the current bridge deck, seismically improving the existing bridge, improving the channel wall lining, armoring the channel bottom, add retaining walls, new medians, traffic signal upgrades at Perez Road and Date Palm Drive and provide drainage improvements. Funding for the project entails \$16.35 million from the federal government, \$1.64 million from CVAG, and \$548,000 from Cathedral City.

Additionally, active transportation features will be included in Project. New sidewalks will be incorporated on each side of the bridge and along the roadway to each of the Project limits, new LED lighted decorative bridge railings will be installed, new ADA ramps, bicycle lanes will be provided in each direction and undercrossing accommodations for the future CV Link Project segment in this area.

This Project is funded by City Capital Improvement Program funds, Coachella Valley Association of Governments Transportation Program funding and Federal Highway Bridge Program funding. The Project is scheduled to be completed in 18 months.

Pedestrian and bicycle safety are also at the forefront of the City's projects. The City was awarded a **Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Grant** of \$1.67 million to improve vehicle safely, pedestrian safety and bicycle safety at 20 intersections throughout the City. This 100% grant funding will provide for upgraded traffic signal equipment, count down timers for pedestrians and enhanced bicycle recognition at grant designated intersections. A Request for Proposal for the design work for this project will be received this upcoming week.

Other projects that the City Staff is working on that will provide active transportation opportunities include the **Cathedral Canyon Bridge Project** over the Whitewater River. This approximately \$22 million project will include a new bridge over the Whitewater River where a low water crossing exists today. This project will include sidewalk and bicycle lanes in each direction as well as roadway widening improvements. Funding for the bridge project involves \$19.5 million from the federal government, \$1.9 million from CVAG, and \$632,000 from Cathedral City.

The Ramon Road Bridge Project over the Whitewater River is also under design, with the City of Palm Springs as the lead agency. This \$36 million Project will not only widen the existing bridge

and roadway from San Luis Rey to Candlewood Drive, it will also provide the next link of connectivity for the Cathedral City Whitewater Bike Path. The bridge deck will include a sidewalk on the north side and a multiuse path on the south side, as well as providing connectivity to the CV Link path that will continue south along the Whitewater River bank in the future. This Project will start in the Fall of 2018. Funding for the bridge project includes \$25 million from the federal government, \$8 million from CVAG, \$1 million from the City of Palm Springs and \$1.6 million from Cathedral City.

The City is also anticipating approval of two grant submittals at the end of this month that directly relate to active transportation safety. Seven applications were submitted to CVAG under their request for projects to be included in the **CVAG Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Program**. Two out of the seven City's submitted projects have been selected for final approval. One of these proposed projects will provide for installation of sidewalks along Date Palm Drive where sidewalks do not exist. The other proposed project will fund a signalized mid-block Pedestrian Crossing at Dinah Shore Drive and Vaquero Road significantly enhancing the pedestrian safety for students attending Cathedral City High School.

The City's Engineering Staff is continually looking for new opportunities to improve our roadway, drainage, traffic and active transportation infrastructure within the City. We continually look for available funding opportunities and have been very successful in securing new grant awards. We know traffic may be slowed down during the times we are constructing these projects, but in the end, our City will have something to be proud of for generations to come. The Engineering Department appreciates your roadway patience as a driver, walker, or bike rider when construction crews are working hard to improve our City.






