Community Update by Police Chief George Crum

As your Police Chief, it is my pleasure to report that, once again, crime in Cathedral City continues to go down. When comparing the crime statistics from January to July of 2016 with January to July of 2017, our city has had a 21% reduction in crime during the first six months. Please refer to the chart below for the monthly comparisons.



You may have seen a few crimes in Cathedral City receive extra media attention, but what you do not see or hear from the media is the significant reduction of crime in Cathedral City. As your Police

Chief, I understand that any crime is too much. However, it is important to look at crime data in a comprehensive manner to see how crime is trending within our community. Cathedral City is the second largest city in the Coachella Valley, and according to Citydata.com, we have the second lowest crime rate in the Coachella Valley. Those are figures to proudly state to your neighbors and friends. Cathedral City is a great place to live, work, stay and play. And the men and women of your police department work very hard to keep it that way.



Your Police Department is fully staffed with 51 Police officers thanks to the community's support and the City Council allowing the department to hire two additional police officers in November of 2016. I know when the Police Department and the Community partner together; we make a lasting impact on reducing crime in our City and send a strong message to the criminal element. While one of the roles of the police is to solve crimes; crime prevention and reduction of crime is a responsibility we must all embrace and accept within our community.

When it comes to crime prevention, taking simple precautions against becoming a victim of crime is both smart and effective. We all have a role to play in crime reduction, crime prevention and community safety. Although we continue to see reductions in crime rates in certain Part 1 crime in the City and across the county, we need to continue to work closely with our many community partners to prevent and reduce crime.

The Police Department invites all of the community to be active participants in increasing the safety of your neighborhoods and businesses. If you see something, say something. 


2nd Saturdays Art Walk on Perez Road
