Community Update by George Crum Police Chief

It is my pleasure to inform you about several changes being implemented at the Cathedral City Police Department that will continue our tradition to serve and protect our residents.

In January of 2016, one of our two captains, Captain Chuck Robinson, who served our community with distinction for more than 20 years, retired from the Cathedral City Police Department. Several months thereafter, Captain Earl Moss also announced his intent to retire from the force on January 3, 2017. With the potential vacancy of two captains within one year, I recognized this unique opportunity to reevaluate the management efficiencies of the department. Over much deliberation and input from multiple resources, I made the



decision to reduce the Department's Command Staff of two captains and replace the two positions with one deputy chief through natural attrition. Reducing staffing from two captains to one deputy chief will result in an annual salary savings of approximately \$89,000 and provide the service demanded by the community.

In June of this year, the City conducted a nationwide search for a new deputy chief position. Qualified applicants were interviewed by three separate interview panels. At the conclusion of this three interview panel process, one candidate was selected. I ask that you join me in welcoming Deputy Chief Travis Walker to the Cathedral Police Department. Deputy Chief Walker will begin his duties on Monday, September 19, 2016.



Deputy Chief Walker will serve as second-in-command of the Organization and oversee the Police Department in the event of my absence. He will oversee the day-to-day management of the Operations Division, Services Division and Investigations Division as the three lieutenants in those respective Divisions will report directly to the deputy chief. The addition of the deputy chief will streamline the Police Department as we continue to focus on our five-year strategic plan, goals and objectives. Please take a moment to read Deputy Chief Walker's short biography to know more about his experience and the expertise he brings to our city.

Deputy Chief Travis Walker joins the Cathedral City Police Department from the San Bernardino Police Department on September 19, 2016. He has valiantly served the San Bernardino area for the last 20 years and has had many opportunities to work on a variety of distinguished assignments throughout his career. His career has provided him the expertise in strategic

leadership to motivate and manage multiple divisions and abilities to project with great ease and demonstrable results. Currently, he is responsible for the overall management of the Northern Policing District in the City of San Bernardino, which encompasses nearly 36 square miles and an approximate population of 120,000 residents. Additionally, Walker is responsible for the management and oversight of the Department's Traffic Bureau, Canine Unit, Community Affairs Unit, Gang Unit, SWAT Team, Hostage Negotiations Team, Fugitive Task Forces, and the Department's Mobile Field Force. Deputy Chief Walker served as the initial Incident Commander and overall Tactical Commander during the terrorist attack in San Bernardino on December 2, 2015.




Movies in the Park
