Community Update by Charlie McClendon City Manager



Dear Neighbors,

I wanted to update you on two local measures that will be appearing on your November 8, 2016 ballot. While both were placed on the ballot for your consideration by a unanimous vote of the City Council, you, the Voters will make the ultimate decision.

Measure HH would allow Cathedral City to expand its local decision-making powers tailored to the unique needs of our local community, while limiting the authority of the state to do so, by becoming a Charter City.

Currently, Cathedral City is a general-law city, meaning that the State Legislature makes laws governing the City. Becoming a charter city would allow Cathedral City to write its own ordinances tailored to the specific needs of the community rather than those made at the state level.

The majority of local cities are charter cities, including La Quinta, Rancho Mirage, Palm Desert, Palm Springs, Desert Hot Springs and Indian Wells here in the Coachella Valley. Increased local control results in enhanced accountability and transparency in local government. Important items to note include:

- Measure HH does not give the Council the power to raise taxes. Any new tax measure would have to be approved by voters.
- The proposed Charter does not increase any eminent domain authority nor does it allow the City Council to increase their salaries. In fact, if enacted, Measure HH requires an automatic decrease in Council salaries to correspond with decreases experienced by any employee bargaining group.
- The City will be empowered to procure its own contracts through our established local regulations, instead of being bound by state bureaucracies—allowing us to spend taxpayer dollars as efficiently as possible and avoiding wasted time and money.

 The charter is a voter-approved document and can only be repealed or amended by a vote of the people.

Measure P expands the existing voter-approved tax on medical cannabis-related businesses to specifically include non-dispensary cannabis businesses. Measure P simply updates the previously approved ordinance to include businesses that did not exist when voters first approved the measure, and factors in other cannabis industry changes anticipated as a result of a State measure on the November ballot.

In 2014 67% of voters approved a tax of up to 15% on the proceeds of sales from medical marijuana dispensaries, which is used to fund general city services including Police and Fire protection, parks maintenance and other services. At the time the 2014 tax was approved, dispensaries were the main type of marijuana business contemplated. Since that time, cultivation and manufacturing operations have been allowed in certain zoning districts. Therefore, Measure P proposes to tax cultivation operations on the basis of the square footage of the cultivation area at \$25 per square foot annually. Manufacturing operations, if Measure P is approved, will be taxed at the rate of \$1.00 per item produced or per ounce of extract produced. Experience in other jurisdictions has indicated these taxing structures are more efficient to administer for both the City and the businesses paying them.


