What's Developing in Economic Development

Talk about ending the year on a high note!

In the last few months, we have celebrated a number of new business openings, and kicked-off a few long-awaited developments. Within our Downtown and east of Trilussa's Restaurant, the Roost Lounge is officially open! The Roost Lounge caters to the LGBTQ community, and friends thereof, while serving great drinks in a trendy atmosphere. It is the second diverse lounge (AMP Sports Lounge) to open in the Pickfair Promenade this year. Both are great places to catch up with old friends or meet new ones.



Another milestone reached in the City was the third of four anchors planned to turn our downtown into an Arts and Entertainment District. The City Council and the Parks and Community Events Commission held a groundbreaking ceremony for the 2.5 acre downtown amphitheater park adjacent to the parking garage at the corner of Avenida Lalo Guerrero and Cathedral Canyon Drive. This park will feature a permanent outdoor stage, restrooms, concession stand, children's play area, and walking paths. With a seating capacity exceeding 2,900 people, this amphitheater park will be an ideal location for our city's festivals, art shows, food truck events, concerts, local theater productions, and much more. Construction will be in full force starting in January and completion of the park is expected in the fall of 2019.

The City Council recently held a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Runway Restaurant (Dining, Drinks, & Drag) located outside of the CCBC Resort Hotel in the Lower Cove. This tastefully decorated full-service restaurant and bar caters to all communities who value diversity and features their own twist on American grill entrées. It is the first full-service restaurant in the downtown area to be built from the ground up in more than a decade. Have your boarding pass in hand and head to the Runway in Cathedral City where they are clouds above the ordinary and their famous white chocolate bread will have you coming back for more.

On the north end of our City, Baycrest Development and Radius Retail Advisors celebrated the opening of "The Crossings at Bob Hope" commercial development. This new freeway-adjacent development located at Bob Hope Drive and Interstate 10 will offer travelers, once completed, a brand new Starbucks Coffee location, an ARCO AM/PM, a Best Western Plus hotel, and two new

additional restaurants, Mc Donald's and Taco Bell. There are three additional pads available for development, and two in-line suites ready for the next great business idea.






Cathedral City Artists' **Exhibit**





Agnes Pelton House Museum Day
