Council Develops Budget to Reflect Community Priorities

During their upcoming Council meeting on May 8, the City Council will consider adoption of the budget for the next two fiscal years. Covering the 19-20 and 20-21 fiscal years (starting July 1 of each calendar year), the budget establishes the priorities of the City by assigning necessary funding to support the various services provided by Cathedral City.

The Councilmembers have been reviewing the budget for the past six weeks in a couple of ways. First, they have individually considered all the proposed line item expenditures in the budget and the estimated revenues, which will support the expenditures. Council members, upon reviewing the written budget proposals, developed questions for Finance Department and operating department staff so they could develop a full understanding of what is included in the proposed budget. Secondly, Council collectively reviewed the proposed budget during two public study session meetings held during April.

Beginning with their goal setting meetings in January and continuing throughout the budget review process, Councilmembers consistently commented on, and developed priorities consistent with their understanding of the priorities of the people of our community. Proposed additions to the budget reflect community priorities in the following areas:

Homelessness – The proposed budget continues funding through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for a partnership with the Coachella Valley Rescue Mission to provide shelter and treatment services for the homeless from Cathedral City. The budget also continues to provide general fund dollars which can be used for contributions to regional efforts to address

homelessness or other partnerships with non-profits. The budget will also add a new Homeless Liaison Officer position in the Police department. This new position will supplement the existing Homeless Liaison Officer position allowing the department to provide coverage seven days a week.

Code Enforcement – In addition to providing funding to continue the existing Code Enforcement programs and services, the proposed budget will add an additional position in Code Enforcement. This new position will help the division to operate more efficiently and effectively, improve response to priority cases and develop improved outreach to the community to make residents more aware of the provision of the code related to property maintenance.

Streets – The proposed budget will add a general fund commitment of \$900,00 to the street Capital Improvement Program (CIP) of the City. This will meet the required maintenance of effort provisions in state law allowing the City to receive SB1 (gas tax) funds for street improvement projects. Collectively, the general fund contributions, SB1 funds, grants and other street funds will allow the following street projects to be initiated in the next two years:

- · West Whitewater Neighborhood Streets reconstruction
- · Slurry and paving projects on DaVall Drive
- Drainage improvements at Date Palm and Los Gatos
- Avenida Maravilla improvements at La Pasada
- · Sarah Street pavement rehabilitation
- Ramon Road bridge and roadway widening (Cathedral City participation in Palm Springs project)
- Avenida Ximino neighborhood street improvements
- · Landau/McCallum traffic signal and intersection improvements
- · Whispering Palms neighborhood street improvements
- Traffic signal upgrades across the City
- · Cathedral Canyon bridge construction


The development of the budget was planned with foresight and resources were provided so that Council will be able to complete their deliberations and approve the proposed budget well in advance of the start of the new fiscal year on July 1. Periodic updates on both revenue collections and the expenditure of funds will be provided to Council throughout the year.
