Community Update

Hello Cathedral City! This will be the last update I write due to having accepted a position with the Beaumont Police Department. I am sad to go but wanted to leave you with an update on all we have accomplished in my ten months as your Acting Chief. What I chose to focus on during my tenor as the Chief was Employee Wellness, Technology and Department staffing.

Something that has been very important to me is the mental health and well-being of our officers. Across the country suicide rates have continued to increase and for the third straight year suicides have outnumbered line of duty deaths. With the help of staff, we have created a Peer Support Program to be there for any employee that might need assistance. Our Peer Support Team have been professionally



trained to take on this roll. The Employee Wellness Team is also putting together some off duty activities for our employees and their families to bring everyone closer together.

We also created a Chaplin Program. The Chaplin can and will be used by our community but will be used primarily for our employees if they need help from clergy during their time of need.

A proposed upgrade to our gym facility is also in the works. The gym has some old broken equipment that is need of replacing or removal. Some other, more modern equipment is being requested so any city employee wanting to use the facilities will have a place to train.

I have also put a high priority on the training of our officers. Training is essential to maintain an educated and professional police department. In addition to what is required by the State for the minimum standards of our employees, I have approved hundreds of hours of additional training. Training in all areas; from use of force, to interview and interrogation, to under the influence, and much more.

Officers from our department have also used their skills to train others. One such example is a Bicycle Enforcement class that our officers taught. We were able to train all the officers from the Palm Springs Unified School District in bicycle techniques and tactics.

If it wasn't for you, our Community, we would not be successful as a police department. We cannot do this without you. Sir Robert Peel, the father of modern policing, said "The police are the community, and the community are the police." Because our relationship with the community is so important, the Police Department has done several things to build that connection. During the

past ten months we held a Community Academy. This is a one day a week class, for eight weeks, to teach its attendees what the police department does. We have also developed and will be soon holding our first all-Spanish Community Academy.

We have attended many, if not all, of the special events here in the community and have held a few of our own. A group of officers recently played several games of dodgeball with one of our local elementary schools. We had a great time building the relationships with the young members of our community. Also, during the Holidays, we held our 1st annual Santa for Seniors event. We served over 200 meals to a group of seniors within our community that did not have the means to celebrate the Holidays. This was a very successful event and enjoyed by all who attended.

Throughout my 32-year career, recruitment and retention has always been a problem. Finding good people to hire without lowering our standards can sometimes be difficult. We have been working hard to fill our vacancies and have gained approval to over hire in anticipation of retirements and others who might be leaving. In the past ten months we have successfully hired 14 employees for different positions within the department.

Another area of importance for a professional and modern police department is the use of technology. Technology can be used to supplement our workforce but cannot replace it. The two need to work hand-in-hand to be successful. Re-evaluating current processes is also important to make sure we are being fiscally responsible and using our systems efficiently. I cancelled the use of a time keeping software that was not working and was taking up more time than it was saving. The police department will be using a component of City Hall's new software for these purposes.

The implementation of a new Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management Software has begun. This is a more modern Cloud based Windows software that will increase the capabilities of the department. From the use of global positioning technology, better on-line reporting, and the ease of report writing, the efficiency of the police department and its personnel will be greatly enhanced.

Drones are another area of technology we have started to take advantage of. We now have three certified drone pilots. These drones can be used as first responders to a scene to quickly assess what police resources are needed. They can be used to document crime and accident scenes and have recently been used in our Homeless Point in Time count.

We have implemented a Camera Program. Ten cameras have recently been purchased and are in the process of being mounted. These will be placed strategically throughout the city to monitor traffic. The footage from these cameras can be used to assist our Investigations Bureau in apprehending criminals. I have also updated the old computer servers used for the storage of our audio-visual systems in the police cars.

I am also happy to report in the last ten months crime has gone down. This is something I cannot take credit for, but I am extremely proud of leading our fine men and women who deserve all the accolades.

So long, farewell, auf Wiedersehen, goodbye. Cathedral City, I will miss you. It has been an honor to have worked with these great men and women. Please continue to support, help and defend your police department. They really care about our community and are doing a fantastic job. Additionally, I have truly enjoyed my time as Chief and working with such a fine group of people. Thank you all!

Movies in the Park - February 22






First Friday Art Walk - Perez Plaza H and I
