
## **Community Update**

### **COVID-19 Continues to Surge in Cathedral City**


The worldwide coronavirus pandemic continues to take a heavy toll on the people within our community. The current surge of cases is the worst it has ever been in our city.

Please take affirmative steps to keep yourself and your loved ones safe while we await for the vaccine to become readily available. Here is a graph of the seven-day average of new cases in Cathedral City:



As you can see our new cases are currently much higher than they were during the summer surge. The seven-day average of new cases in the summer peaked at 33.57 new cases per day on July 14. Today, the seven-day average of new cases is 84.71 per day, more than twice the July peak.

Tragically, we are also experiencing a horrible number of deaths from COVID in our community:



These deaths are not just numbers on a chart. They are our grandparents, neighbors, brothers, sisters and loved ones. We must take this pandemic seriously and every one of us must do what we can to control the spread.

The emergency order currently in place in Cathedral City mandates wearing facial coverings at all times unless you are at home with only members of your immediate household or in your private vehicle alone or with members of your immediate household. Social distancing is required whenever you are around people outside of your immediate household. 
### By the Numbers:

As of January 14, 2021, Cathedral City had a total of 5,613 confirmed COVID-19 cases (+657 since last week) and 63 reported deaths (+7 since last week). Other Coachella Valley cities are reporting the following:


Coachella 6,598 cases (+662), 55 deaths (+6)

Desert Hot Springs 3,202 cases (+377), 43 deaths (+3)
Indian Wells 159 cases (+13), 6 deaths (+1)
Indio 9,921 cases (+1,170), 140 deaths (+10)
La Quinta 2,664 cases (+346), 37 deaths (+7)
Palm Desert 3,110 cases (+397), 75 deaths (+2)
Palm Springs 2,939 cases (+337), 80 deaths (+2)
Rancho Mirage 805 cases (+118), 27 deaths (+1)

Riverside County has reported 233,480 COVID-19 cases (+29,153), 2,399 deaths (+210), and 150,726 recovered cases (+16,745).


