Community Update

The Capital Improvement Program

All of the City's departments are guided by publicly vetted City Council approved strategic documents. These provide the necessary direction for each individual department to progress into the future in alignment with all the other departments. For example, the Police and Fire Departments are guided by their respective Strategic Plans, the



Planning Department is guided by the General Plan and the Administrative Services (Finance) Department is guided by the City's Budget (a document that is reviewed and reproduced every two fiscal years). Similarly, the Engineering and Public Works Departments are guided by the Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

The CIP is a five-year plan that identifies capital projects proposed to be constructed within the City. It provides a schedule of the construction and identifies the funding source. It also outlines where the future infrastructure needs of the City are located.

These past few months, the Engineering and Public Works Departments have worked long hours with the Administrative Services Department and the City Council to determine what projects are needed next year as well as future years. We looked at available funds currently appropriated and those in the future. The CIP document was produced and approved by the City Council for Fiscal Years 2021 – 2022 and 2022 – 2023 Capital Improvement Program, which can be found within the City's Approved Budget for these same fiscal years.

In the approved CIP document, we have several long-term projects that are currently in the planning stage or currently under way:

- The Da Vall/I-10 Interchange A project that will take several more steps and years to complete.
- The Ramon Road Bridge Widening Palm Springs is the lead agency on this Project, and we should expect construction within the next three years.
- The Vista Chino Bridge Again, Palm Springs is the lead agency on this Project, and construction is not anticipated for at least five years.
- The Ofelia Bringas Memorial Bridge (aka Cathedral Canyon Bridge) This Project is under construction and will be completed in the Spring of 2022.
- HSIP Cycle 9A (Ten Intersections) This Project will continue the City's work on improving 10 more intersections and the respective equipment at each. Design is nearly complete on this Project.

- HSIP Cycle 9B (Varner Road/Date Palm Drive Safety Improvements) This Project is under design and will provide safety improvements along the Varner Road and Date Palm Drive corridor from Mountain View to I-10. Unfortunately, this Grant did not provide for paving.
- Cathedral Canyon Bike Lane and Sidewalk Project—This Grant funded Project will construct a multi-use path on the east side of Cathedral Canyon Drive and a sidewalk and bicycle lane on the west side from Dinah Shore Drive to the new Ofelia Bringas Memorial Bridge. The design on this Project is nearly complete.
- Date Palm Drive East Bike Lane and Sidewalk Project This Grant funded project will construct curb gutter, bike lanes and sidewalk on the east side of Date Palm Drive from East Palm Canyon to Perez Road, including the widening of the North Cathedral Canyon Stormwater Channel. The design on this Project is 50% complete.
- East Palm Canyon Bike Lane This Grant funded project will construct/paint/sign bike lanes along East Palm Canyon Drive from west City limits to Cathedral Canyon. The design on this Project is nearly complete with final reviews underway.
- Los Gatos Drainage at Date Palm Drive This Project will address the regional flood water pass through that ponds in this area and breaks out to the east. This Project has been studied by CVAG, which may provide additional funds to participate in this Project.

The new projects listed on the approved CIP slated for design and/or construction this next fiscal year are as follows:

- Sarah Street Paving Rehabilitation This Project will reconstruct all of the Sarah Road section of streets
- Landau/McCallum Intersection This Project will design and install traffic signals for this intersection.
- Century Park Neighborhood Street Rehabilitations This Project will rehabilitate/refurbish/reconstruct streets within the Century Park neighborhood area.
- Date Palm Drive, I-10 to Varner Road This majority CVAG funded Project is the next phase of widening the Date Palm roadway corridor from I-10 to Varner Road.
- Via De Anza Street Rehabilitation This Project will construct curb, gutter, sidewalk and roadway paving along Via De Anza and connecting streets from Dinah Shore Drive to Ortega Road.
- Ramon Road REAS east of Date Palm Drive This Project will REAS (Rubberized Emulsion Aggregate Slurry) on Ramon Road east of Date Palm Drive to Da Vall Drive.
- Corral Road REAS This Project will place REAS on Corral Road from Date Palm Drive to Cathedral Canyon.
- Avenida Los Ninos Surface Widening This Project will add asphalt width on Avenida Los Ninos from north of McCallum Way to 30th
- HSIP Cycle 10 Crosswalk at Ramon and Avenida La Paloma This Grant funded project will add a HAWK Pedestrian Crosswalk along Ramon Road near Avenida La Paloma and also add a median barrier within the same area.

All of the above listed new projects amount to more than \$11.4 million in new infrastructure improvements, funded from various sources.

With the above stated, the current projects within the CIP and the new projects that will commence this fiscal year will continue to support the exciting growth that is happening within the City. Each project is important, whether a neighborhood street, a traffic signal, bridge or industrial area street reconstruction. All of these projects contribute the quality of life for our City residents and visitors.

The Engineering and Public Works Departments are excited to get started on the new projects and complete the ones already in progress. Your support has a lot to do with our positive energy. We appreciate your cooperation and support in the construction zones while we continue to fix

the roadways. We look forward to moving into new areas of the City with additional infrastructure improvements starting in July.
