
Community Update

What is ATP?

ATP this and ATP that, you hear a lot about ATP now adays especially if you are interested in bicycles, walking and roadways. No, it is not a new brand of gasoline additive; in fact, it is the opposite. ATP means Active Transportation Program. This type of active transportation refers to modes of transportation that require human power, like walking and bicycling, thus "active transportation."

Why am I talking about this today? Well, Cathedral City has several things going on that bring attention to the ATP within the City. First, the General Plan Imagine 2040 is going through the final steps of adoption. In this document, the City committed additional resources to have all the existing and future pedestrian and bicycle facilities routes identified throughout the City. An excerpt from that document follows:




The General Plan is the roadmap to the future as we grow, and these types of maps provide the information for new development as well as areas that will be redeveloped. The designation of bicycle routes, pedestrian facilities and even, neighborhood electric vehicle (NEV, aka street legal golf carts) routes are incorporated into the Final General Plan (the Final version to be published soon and available on the City's website). Incorporation of the ATP within the General Plan allows the City to qualify and/or petition for funding grants from various sources, such as Cal Trans, Federal Highways, Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) and the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG); which all look at the City's General Plan for a confirmation that the ATP has been vetted and approved by the City.

The City's efforts for its ATP have been very successful in the past and soon we will see the fruits of two grants related to ATP that the City has been awarded. The first grant is the joint City/CVAG combined effort on receiving an ATP Cycle 5 Grant for the Palm Canyon Bike Lane Project, the Cathedral Canyon Drive Bike Lanes, Sidewalk and Multi-Use Trail Project and the Date Palm Drive Bike Lanes and Sidewalks Project in the combined amount of \$4.383 million. The total Project's cost is \$5.556 million; thus, the City's participation amount is \$1.173 million. This City participation amount is further reduced with a \$338,400 Grant awarded to the City from RCTC relating to the Cathedral Canyon portion of this ATP Project as well (this funding is like getting an extra scoop of ice cream on the cone).

The three projects in this ATP Cycle 5 Grant are further described below.

- East Palm Canyon Drive (Hwy. 111) from Golf Club Dr. to Cathedral Canyon Drive –
 This Project adds in roadway bike lanes on the north and south side of the road within
 existing right of way.
- 2. Cathedral Canyon Drive from Dinah Shore Dr. to Canyon Shores Drive This Project will construct a sidewalk and widen existing striped bike lanes on the west side of the roadway construct an off-road multi-use bike/pedestrian trail on east side of road. There will be a HAWK crosswalk placed along this stretch of roadway to allow a protected perpendicular crossing. The existing four lanes of traffic will remain.
- 3. Date Palm Drive (East Side) from East Palm Canyon Drive (Hwy. 111) to Perez Road This Project will compliment the CV Link trail extension planned along a portion of this roadway segment. This Project will add a sidewalk and an in-street bike lane along east side of road, which includes widening of existing short span bridge over the North Cathedral City Flood Control Channel.



The construction plans for these projects are nearly completed and small right of way acquisitions are underway. It is anticipated that the construction of these Projects will be underway in 2022 and completion in 2023. As we have discussed in the past regarding grants, there are a lot of checks and balances when receiving grant funding to ensure that the funding is applied directly to the Projects and that the Projects are completed.
